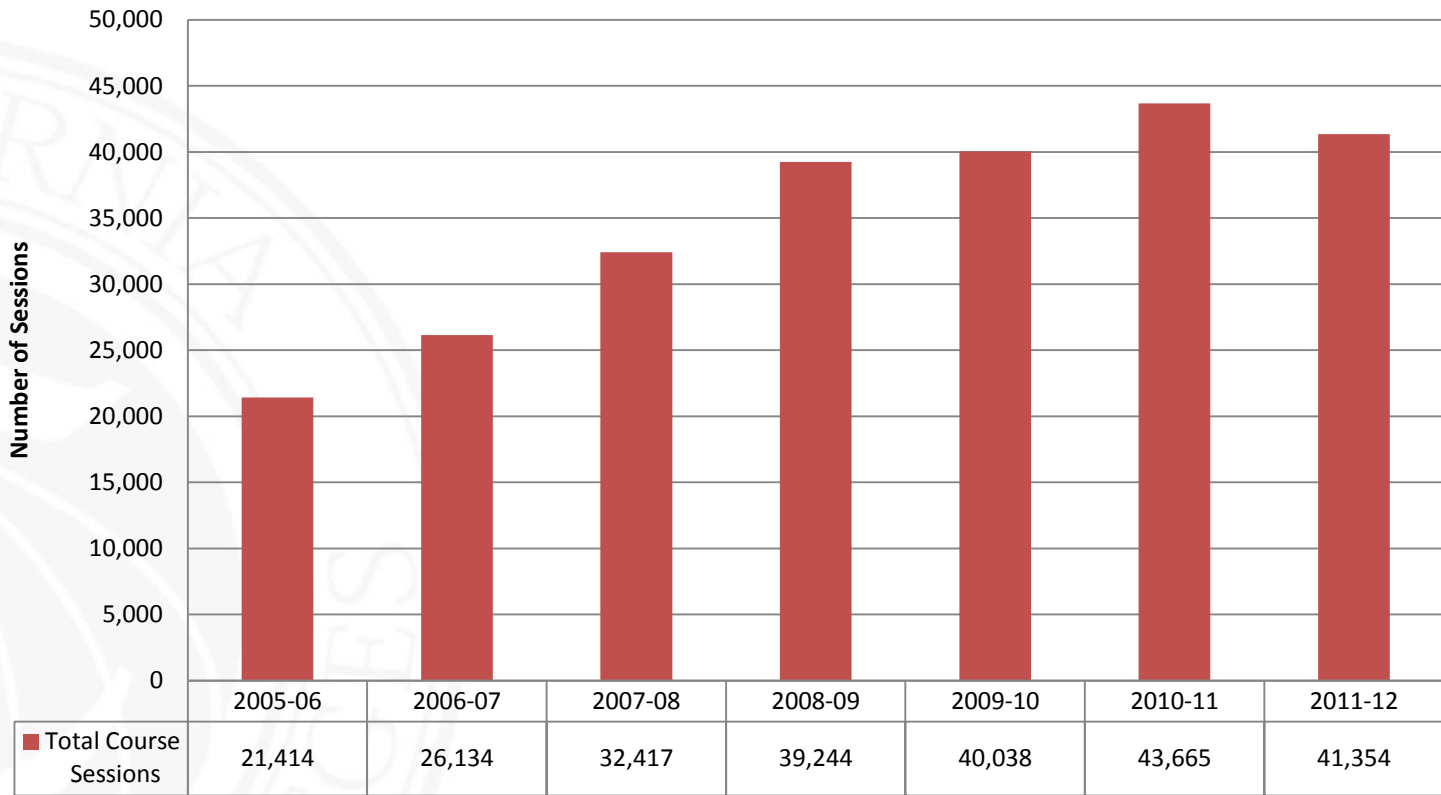

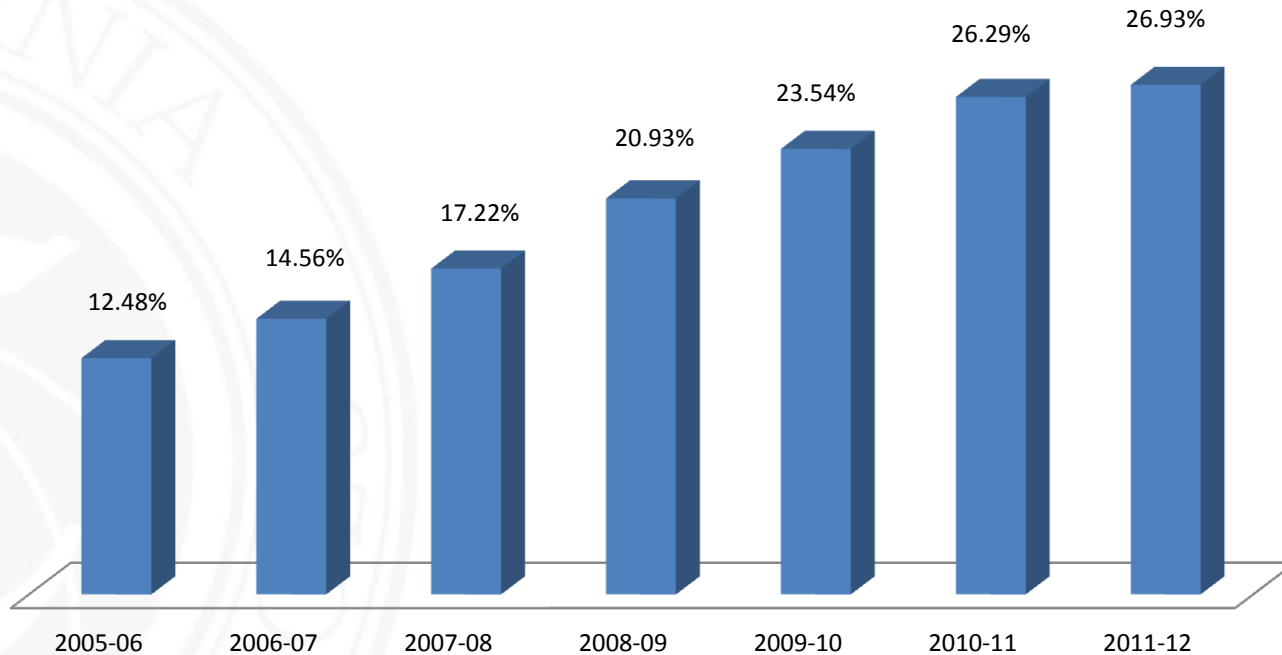

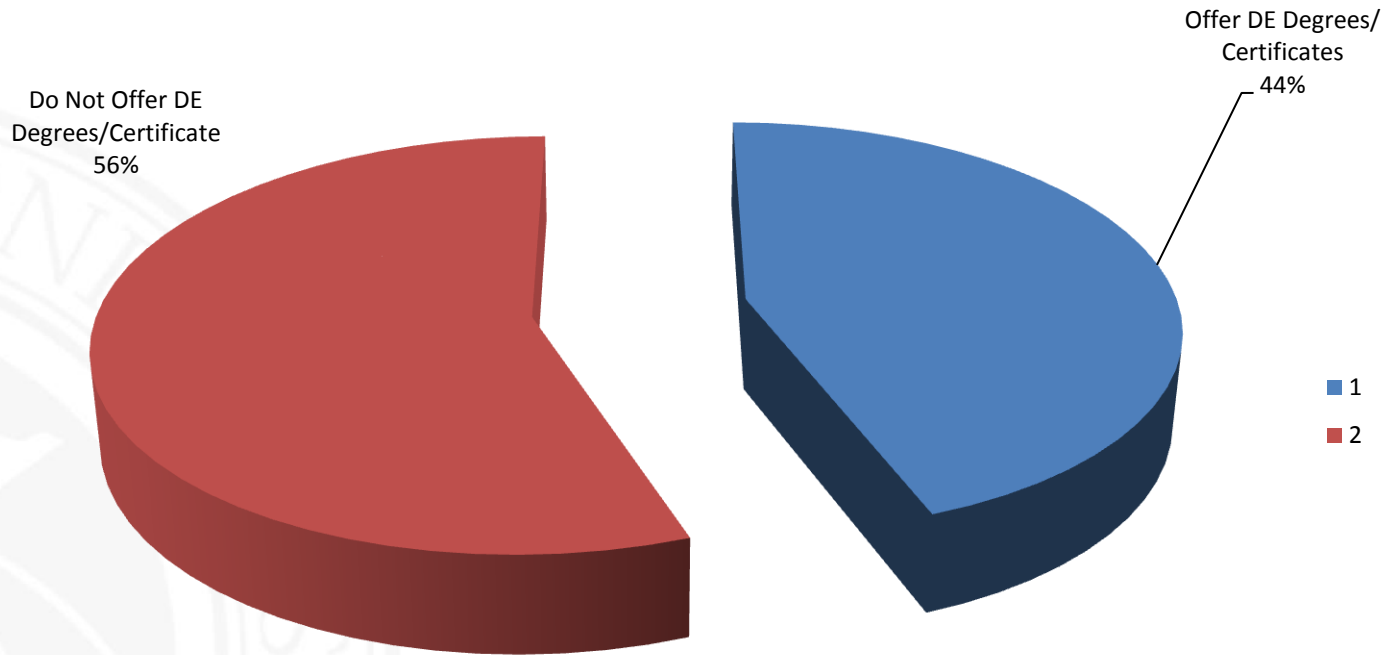
Total DE Course Sessions from 2005-06 to 2011-12



Percent of CCC Students Taking at Least 1 DE Course



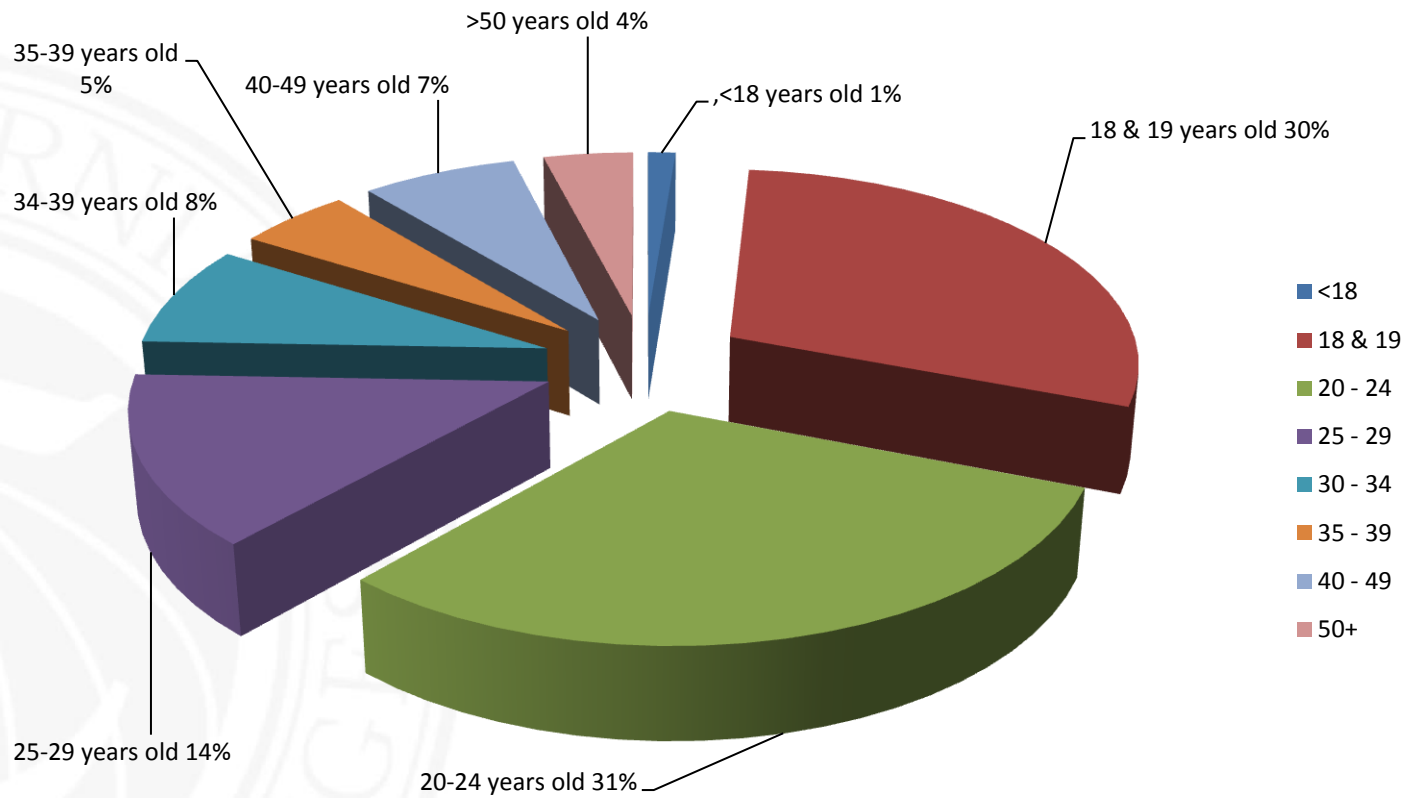

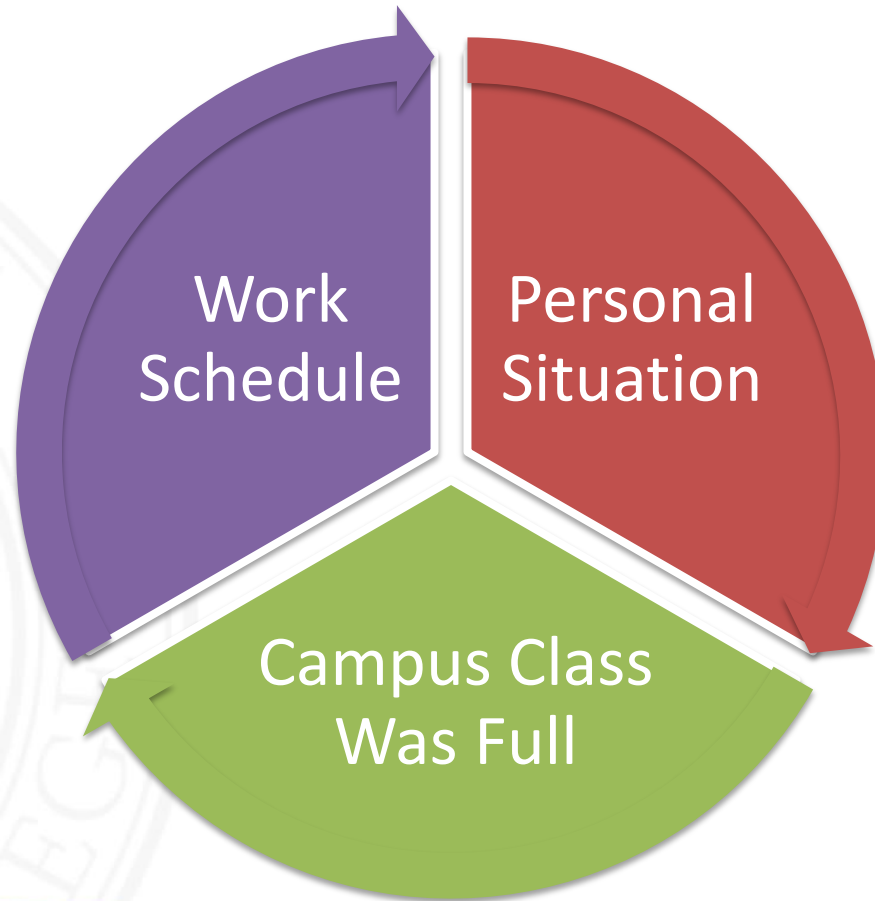
Most Common Methods Used to Develop Curriculum by Faculty in 2011-12	Overall Rank
